Program Starts September 6, 2022

Accelerated 1-Year Full-Time Program: 51 weeks of instruction with a graduation date of August 28, 2023.

Classes scheduled Monday-Thursday, 8:30am - 3:30pm. Occasional Friday classes.

Prerequisites

- High school graduation or equivalent
- Interview with a program instructor

Graduation Requirements

- 70% or higher grade in each module
- Successful completion of required certifications
- Attendance of 90% or higher

Program Benefits

- **Hands on Training:** Students will have hands on training during the program in SPCA Shelter, Clinic and the Animal Redemption Center (ARC) as well as other facilities.
- **Build strong working relationships** in the animal welfare community.

Instructors

Instructors are experienced industry professionals and are approved and regulated by the Department of Labour and Advanced Education, Private Career College Division.

Modules

Business Administration – 100 hours

This module teaches the basic daily skills required to excel in an administrative role in a number of animal welfare related industries.

Customer Services – 100 hours

This module teaches the skills needed to communicate effectively with clients and provide excellent customer service.

Animal Care Attendant – 160 hours

This module teaches how to safely work with animals as well as occupational health and safety procedures found in businesses in the animal welfare sector.

Veterinary Hospital Reception – 128 hours

This module teaches the skills to be an effective front end team member in a veterinary hospital.

Animal Handling Level 1 – 128 hours

This module teaches the skills to handle animals and become an animal welfare educator and advocate.

Animal Nutrition – 128 hours

This module will teach the basics of nutrition and then the specifics of nutritional needs of cats and dogs in different life stages and health levels.

Exotic Animal Handling – 30 hours

This elective module is for students who are interested in a career involving exotic pets and wildlife. The module will cover the basics of care and handling of birds, reptile and small mammals.

Animal Nursing – 144 hours

This module teaches students to be educated advocates of preventive care for pets who are able to discuss the benefits of this care with pet owners.

Animal Handling Level 2 – 120 hours

This module covers more advanced animal handling techniques for specific veterinary procedures and for working with aggressive and fearful animals safely.

Large Animal Handling – 30 hours

This elective module is for students who are interested in a career involving horses and or farm animals. This module will provide an introduction to the care and handling of horses, pigs, cows, chickens, goats and sheep.

Internship – 160 hours

This is a 160 hour internship completed at an approved animal welfare business of the students choosing.
