PLAN AHEAD

- Make sure you have:
 - Food and water for 3-7 days
 - Collar with tags
 - Bathroom necessities, i.e., poop bags/kitty litter
 - Pet first aid kit
 - Keep in an area that is easily accessible for all household members
- Have a spare leash/carrier
- Take a current picture of your pet
- Have a list of pet-friendly places

DURING EMERGENCY

- Keep pets inside during severe weather
- Create a safe space with a blanket and toys
- In case of evacuation, bring all pets with you, if possible
 - Have their crate ready
- Have pee pads for inside your home, to prevent outside hazards

AFTER EMERGENCY

- Survey your home for hazards
- Examine your pets for injuries
- If your pet is lost, check shelters and social media pages

PET FIRST AID KIT

- Gauze pads
- Adhesive tape
- Cotton balls/swabs
- 3% hydrogen peroxide to induce vomiting (consult a vet before using)
- Ice pack
- Disposable gloves
- Scissors with blunt end
- Tweezers (tick remover)
- OTC antibiotic ointment
- Medication (i.e. gravel for a pet's upset tummy)
- Oral Syringe
- Pet shampoo for bathing
- Towels
- Small Flashlight
- Alcohol wipes
- Styptic powder
- Saline eye solution
- Personal phone number, vet address including number/names, and local vet clinics
